# ALANYA CASTLE



*Alanya Castle is one of the iconic castles of Alanya, a district of Antalya. It is situated on a peninsula rising approximately 250 meters above sea level. Its walls have a total length of 6.5 kilometers. Built during the Hellenistic period, the castle is located in the settlement of Alanya, which was called Kandeleri in ancient times.*

*The castle, whose current historical structure is a 13th-century Seljuk work, actually dates back to the Hellenistic period. It was built by Seljuk Sultan Alaeddin Keykubat I, who conquered and rebuilt the city in 1221.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the castle by transfer or by taking public transport from the stop in front of the hotel.***

# KIZILKULE



*The Red Tower, a unique example of 13th-century medieval Mediterranean defensive structures, was built by the Seljuk ruler Alaaddin Keykubat I and the Aleppo-based master builder Abu Ali Reha el Kettani to protect the harbor, shipyard, and Alanya Castle from attacks coming from the sea.*

*The Red Tower has five floors: a ground floor, a first floor, a mezzanine floor, an open floor, and an open terrace.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the Red Tower by using transfers or by taking public transport from the bus stop in front of the hotel.***

# SHIPYARD



*The Alanya shipyard is not only a shipbuilding facility or a wintering ground for ships, but also a permanent structure with ironworks, administrative areas, and storage facilities where repairs, sailing, and ship equipment can be manufactured.*

*Until the 1960s, the shipyard continued to be used for boat building and repair; today it serves as a museum dedicated to maritime history and ships. Walking along a wooden walkway from the entrance, one sees an antique crane in the first section, and in the second section, an uncapped *çekevele* (a fast sailing boat used for logistics and supply in the Ottoman navy throughout history), a mizzen (the mast located at the stern of the boat), and a spar (a sail on the mast).*

*In the first compartment you can see the horizontally placed piece used for opening the deck, one main mast (the longest mast of the boat), shipbuilding tools and a freshwater well, ancient anchors in the fourth compartment, and tools used for navigation on ships in the fifth compartment.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the shipyard/port area by using transfers or by taking public transport from the stop in front of the hotel.***

# DAMLATAŞ CAVE



*Damlataş Cave was discovered in 1948 during the opening of a quarry to obtain stone for use in the construction of the port.*

*The cave is named Damlataş (Dripstone) because of the water droplets that continuously drip from the stalactites. Besides its captivating beauty, the cave is also famous for its air, which is beneficial for asthma sufferers. The cave's air remains constant year-round; the temperature is 22 degrees Celsius, the humidity is 95 percent, and the constant pressure is 760 mm. The air in the cave contains 71 percent nitrogen, 20.5 percent oxygen, 2.5 parts per ten thousand carbon dioxide, and a small amount of radioactivity and ions.*

*It is the first cave in Turkey to be opened to tourism.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the Damlataş Cave by using transfers or by taking public transport from the bus stop in front of the hotel.***

# DIM CAVE



*Located 11 km from Alanya, the cave is situated 232 m above sea level on the summit of Mount Cebeli Reis.*

*Dim Cave, consisting of 4 galleries, is 360 m long horizontally, and 10-15 m wide and high. Inside the cave, there are rich formations of stalactites, stalagmites, and travertines. At the end of the cave, 17 m deeper than the entrance, there is a small lake with a water surface area of 200 m<sup>2</sup>. It is the second largest cave in Turkey open to visitors.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach Dim Cave by transfer or by taking public transport from the bus stop in front of the hotel.***

# SAPADERE CANYON



*Opened in 2008, this canyon, nestled among the rugged Taurus Mountains, is surrounded on three sides by high mountains and is 750 meters long. Located 400 meters above sea level, the canyon is approximately 10-15 meters wide and surrounded by karst rock formations reaching 150-200 meters in circumference. Its water is cold and oxygen-rich as it emerges from within the rocks of the Taurus Mountains.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the Damlataş Cave by using transfers or by taking public transport from the bus stop in front of the hotel.***

# DIM TEA



*The river, originating in the Taurus Mountains, flows for approximately 60 kilometers. Its water remains cold year-round, making it an ideal spot, especially in summer, for those seeking refuge from the oppressive heat of the Mediterranean. Numerous restaurants and tea gardens line the parallel road. These restaurants continue after the regulator, approximately 7-8 kilometers from the main road. A common feature of these restaurants and picnic areas is the tables placed in the river itself. The upper reaches of the river are used for rafting.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach it by transfer or by taking public transport from the bus stop in front of the hotel towards Dim Çayı.***

# CABLE CAR



## Ecological Transportation

Alanya Cable Car offers "ecologically conscious transportation" with its technology elegantly integrated into nature. Great care is taken to protect the environment and consume natural resources efficiently at every stage of its construction and operation. It incorporates all the advantages of ecological transportation. Designed to operate in all weather conditions, the Alanya Cable Car system can continue to operate uninterrupted even in rain, wind, and high temperatures.

Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the Damlatas Cave/Cable Car area by using transfers or by taking public transport from the bus stop in front of the hotel.

# MANAVGAT WATERFALL



*It is a waterfall located on the Manavgat River in the Manavgat district of Antalya. Although it falls from a relatively low height, it flows with a high volume of water over a wide area.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach Manavgat Waterfall by transfer or by taking public transport from the bus stop in front of the hotel.***

# *SIDE ANCIENT CITY*



*The ancient city of Side, founded in the 7th century BC, is among the most important settlements in history. Belonging to the Pamphylia region, this historical city was initially part of the Lydian Kingdom and remained under its rule for many years. Later, Side passed to the Persian Kingdom, and when Alexander the Great desired the region, it came under the control of the Macedonian King.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the Manavgat Side Ancient City by using transfers or by taking public transport from the stop in front of the hotel.***

# ASPENDOS ANCIENT CITY



Aspendos, only *The best not just of Anatolia, but of the entire*  
Aspendos is famous for *Mediterranean area well preserved* Roman-era theater. The city is  
situated on a hilltop plateau near the Köprüçay (ancient Eurymedon), one of the  
region's largest rivers. Its access to the Mediterranean and its development are  
largely due to the nearby river and the fertile lands surrounding it. Today,  
visitors mostly focus on the theater and aqueducts.

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach Aspendos by using transfers or by taking public transport from the stop in front of the hotel.***

# ANTALYA CASTLE CENTER



*Antalya's Kaleiçi (Old Town) is protected by two thick, horseshoe-shaped walls. One of these fortified walls is located in the bay on the seashore, and the other is on the land side. In addition to these walls, there are also walls separating various settlements, and there are towers approximately every fifty steps on the outer walls. The narrow streets within the walls extend upwards from the harbor along the wall. The Fluted Minaret, Keyhüsrev Madrasa, Karatay Madrasa, İskele Mosque, and Tekeli Mahmut Pasha Mosque are just some of the important historical monuments within the city walls.*

***Since it's not within walking distance of our hotel, you can reach the Antalya Old Town area by using transfers or by taking public transport from the stop in front of the hotel.***

# CODE OF CONDUCT FOR VISITING HISTORICAL SITES

## *1. Be respectful:*

- Please be quiet, do not speak loudly.*
- Show respect at places of prayer, monuments, or sacred sites.*

- Do not touch historical structures and artifacts such as stones, columns, and statues.*
- Avoid actions that could cause damage.*

## *3. Follow the Photography Rules:*

- Flashlight use may be prohibited, please pay attention to the signs.*
- Photography may be prohibited in some areas; please check the signs.*

## *4. Don't litter:*

- Keep the areas clean, use the trash cans.*

## *5. Do not damage the areas:*

*-Writing, scratching, or leaving marks is strictly forbidden.*

## *6. Obey Direction and Warning Signs:*

*-Please pay attention to entry and exit directions and restricted areas.*

## *7. Protecting Your Belongings:*

*-Avoid carrying bags or walking sticks in a way that they come into contact with the artworks.*

## *8. Please Pay Attention to Dress Code:*

*-Appropriate clothing may be required in religious buildings such as mosques*

# CODE OF CONDUCT FOR VISITING NATURE SITES

## **1. Do not harm nature:**

- Do not pick plants, do not touch living things.**
- Leave natural elements like stones, branches, and flowers in their original locations.**
- Leave nature "without a trace".**

## **3. Use the Walking Paths:**

- Do not stray from designated paths; avoid causing erosion.**

## **5. Do not light a fire:**

- Lighting a fire is dangerous except in designated areas.**
- Do not throw cigarette butts into nature.**

## **7. Vehicle Use:**

- Do not drive motorized vehicles into nature; use designated parking areas.**

## **9. Respect Animal Rights:**

- Do not participate in any activity that harms, exploits, or abuses animals; do not buy products derived from such practices. Protect both nature and living beings through your responsible choices.**

## **2. Do not litter:**

- Carry your waste with you or throw it in the trash can.**

## **4. Be Quiet:**

- Please avoid making noise and disturbing wildlife.**

## **6. Follow Camp Rules:**

- Camping should only be done in designated areas.**
- Use environmentally friendly materials.**

## **8. Follow Local Rules and Guidelines:**

- There may be special rules in protected areas.**

# CODE OF CONDUCT IN THE AREA

## **MY DRESS AND CONDUCT RULES**

- Avoid walking around the city center in revealing clothing outside of the beach.**
- Please avoid speaking excessively loudly in public.**

## **TRAFFIC and SAFETY**

- In our country, traffic flows on the right lane.**
- Use the lane designated for bicycles/scooters.**
- Please use pedestrian crossings when crossing the street. Pay attention to the traffic light when using the pedestrian crossing. Do not jump into the road immediately.**

## **SHOPPING and BARGAINING**

- Bargaining is common in markets; you can do it politely.**
- Treat the seller respectfully and don't waste time lingering on an item you don't intend to buy.**

## **ABUSE and SECURITY**

- Avoid physical contact with children. (Hugging, stroking, kissing, etc.)**
- If you notice anything suspicious (child abuse, illegal activity, etc.), report it immediately to the hotel management or call the police at 112.**

## **LOCAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS**

- The use and trade of drugs and illegal substances are strictly prohibited.**
- Alcohol consumption is restricted in public places and can only be consumed in authorized locations.**
- The sale of alcohol and cigarettes to individuals under the age of 18 is prohibited.**

## **CHILDREN AND SAFETY**

- Do not give money to children who beg or work on the streets (selling beads, tissues, etc.). This can prevent children from going to school.**
- If you would like to help, you can apply to official institutions or associations.**

- Don't forget to ask people's permission before taking their photos.**

# CULTURAL FLAVORS



## *Turkish Tea*

*A type of black tea is produced in Türkiye, grown along the Eastern Black Sea coast. This type of tea is popularly known as Turkish tea. It is brewed with ground roasted black tea and served in distinctive small glasses known as "thin-waisted" glasses.*

## *Turkish Coffee*

*Turkish coffee is one of the oldest coffee preparation and brewing methods in Turkish culture, dating back to the Ottoman Empire. It has a unique identity and tradition with its distinctive taste, foam, aroma, and serving style. It is the only type of coffee served with its grounds. As of 2013, Turkish coffee culture and tradition were inscribed on the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity on behalf of our country.*



# CULTURAL FLAVORS



## *Ayran*

*Ayran is a type of beverage made by adding water to yogurt. It is one of the most common drinks in Turkish cuisine. The Göktürks, who ruled between 552 and 745 AD, added water to yogurt to reduce its sourness, thus accidentally creating ayran. The word ayran was first defined in history in the Divan-i Lügat-it Türk as "a drink made from milk."*

## *Raki*

*Suma, obtained through distillation, is a traditional Turkish alcoholic drink native to the Turkish region, and is usually flavored with anise seeds.*



# CULTURAL FLAVORS



## *Pistachio Lemonade*

*'Pistachio Lemonade', a characteristic drink of Alanya's cuisine, frequently served at circumcision, engagement, and betrothal ceremonies, as well as during hospitality, and enjoyed year-round, has been registered by the Turkish Patent and Trademark Office as a result of initiatives undertaken by Alanya Municipality.*

## *Finally*

*Turkish delight is a traditional Turkish sweet prepared according to proper techniques, using a mixture of water, sugar, starch, and citric acid, tartaric acid, or potassium bitartrate, with the addition of flavorings, dried or dehydrated fruits, and similar ingredients as needed.*

After the rolled-out dough is filled with various ingredients and cooked over a wood fire, it is a type of Turkish pastry prepared by cooking. "Közmen," meaning bread cooked over embers during the Seljuk period, is one of the first terms used to mean gözleme (a type of Turkish flatbread).

## Cat

The dough for the fritters is prepared by kneading. Small balls of dough are made from the mixture and rolled out for frying.

The rolled-out dough is fried in hot oil and can be served. In the Alanya region, it is made and distributed at religious gatherings (mevlit).



# CULTURAL INFORMATION



## ***TURKISH BATH***

***In Anatolia, there has been a bathhouse culture since ancient times. The Turks, while living in Central Asia, carried their existing bathhouse traditions to Anatolia upon their migration. They built their own traditions upon the marble bathhouse culture left by their predecessors. Over time, bathhouses became places where very special occasions were celebrated. Even today, traditions such as "bridal bath," "postpartum bath," "baby's forty-day bath," "votive bath," and "mourning bath" for women, and "groom's bath," "circumcision bath," "soldier's bath," and "holiday bath" for men, remain relevant.***

# CULTURAL INFORMATION

Silk cocoon farming is a traditional production activity that was widely practiced in Alanya in the past.

Starting with mulberry trees, the silk cocoons obtained from them are used to create various flowers and decorative items by hand. This production is an important handicraft reflecting the cultural heritage of the region.



# *CULTURAL INFORMATION*

Gourd carving is a unique craft among Alanya's traditional handicrafts and is considered one of the region's symbols. Dried gourds are carved and transformed into lamps, ornaments, and decorative items. This handcrafted art reflects Alanya's cultural heritage and aesthetic sensibility.



# CULTURAL & ART OBJECTS

The gramophone is a mechanical musical instrument invented in the late 19th century, used to play sound recordings and music. It reads the sounds on the record with a needle; the vibrations are amplified and heard through a funnel (tube). It does not use electricity, it works entirely mechanically.



In Alanya, shipping has played an important role in trade and maritime transport throughout history, thanks to its location on the Mediterranean coast.

The Alanya Shipyard and port, built during the Seljuk period, demonstrate that the region was a maritime center.



This earthenware amphora is a traditional vessel reflecting Mediterranean culture, historically used for storing products such as olive oil and wine.

Handmade ceramic bowls are decorative items adorned with traditional Anatolian motifs and vibrant colors. They reflect cultural heritage and are preferred both for daily use and as decorative objects.



The Tortoise Trainer, painted by Osman Hamdi Bey in 1906, is one of the most famous works of Turkish art. The painting symbolizes themes of patience, tradition, and social criticism, and is considered a powerful allegory reflecting Ottoman culture.



The Maiden's Tower, located on the Bosphorus in Istanbul, is one of the city's oldest and most iconic structures. Throughout history, it has been used for surveillance, defense, and as a lighthouse; and with its legends, it has become an important part of Istanbul's cultural heritage.

# BIODIVERSITY

*The Antalya coastline is one of the nesting areas for Caretta Caretta sea turtles. To protect and coexist with sea turtles, whose breeding season is between May 1st and October 1st, necessary arrangements are being made on the beach. Please pay attention if you see warning signs in the coastal areas.*

*The Alanya Herbarium Museum, which houses endemic plant species of Alanya, contains 115 plant species collected from Alanya Castle. According to scientific sources, 8 of these are endemic species because they grow only in the castle area. The three most special endemic species are Snake's Pillow, Cornflower, and Cakshir Herb.*

# WASTE MANAGEMENT

- To encourage the separate collection and recycling of recyclable waste, separate bins for each type of waste have been placed in the areas, and our guests and staff have been encouraged to do so.
- We train our employees on the importance and practices of zero waste.
- We make sure to buy chemicals in large packages.
- Hazardous waste is regularly collected in a hazardous waste room and handed over to a licensed waste transport company.
- We switched from disposable cups to reusable cups in the rooms.



# *ENERGY MANAGEMENT*

- Our hotel uses LED lighting.
- Motion-activated lighting is available in common areas and restrooms.
- The hotel entrance area is glass-enclosed, providing natural lighting and ventilation.
- In our rooms, our minibars are positioned away from heat sources to save energy.
- Washing machines are not started without being fully loaded; we provide our staff with the necessary training.
- Electronic key cards are used in our rooms.
- Our staff receives training on cost-saving measures, and our guests are informed about our cost-saving practices.



## WATER MANAGEMENT

- The toilets use a dual flush system.
- With the towel rack system, towels can be washed as needed.
- Our wastewater is connected to the sewage system in accordance with discharge regulations.
- Our staff receives water conservation training, and we ask for the support of our guests through informative notices.
- Shower heads and faucets are equipped with water-saving aerators.
